Rock Energy Cooperative offers two opportunities for high school students to learn more about the political process and develop leadership skills.

The co-op will sponsor two high school juniors on the 2018 Electric Cooperative Youth Tour to Washington, D.C. The June 8-15 trip includes meetings with congressional representatives and tours of historic sites.

Another program is open to current high school freshmen, sophomores, and juniors. The Wisconsin Energy Cooperative Association's Youth Leadership Congress, scheduled for July 25-27 at UW-River Falls, introduces students to cooperative business basics and offers sessions to help develop leadership skills.

Applicants for both programs must be children of Rock Energy members and reside in the co-op's service territory. The deadline to apply for the Washington trip is Feb. 28, and applications for the UW-River Falls event must be received by April 13.

Homeowner Insurance Policies Cover Loss from Power Outages

Rock Energy Cooperative works diligently to make sure your electricity is there when you need it; but like all things, nothing is 100 percent guaranteed.

Power outages or voltage issues—whether triggered by a storm, lightning, trees, equipment failure, animals, or vehicles hitting power poles—can damage computer equipment, TVs, and other appliances in your home.

These events are out of our control, and Rock Energy Cooperative does not compensate for any damaged equipment.

However, most homeowner's insurance policies cover losses from power interruptions that are caused by lightning, windstorms, and other sources.

Make sure you're familiar with your policy and what is covered. Call your agent if you're not sure about your specific coverage.

You can help protect your own equipment by unplugging it during a storm or power outage and by installing surge protection.

Energy Efficiency Tip of the Month Periodically inspect your dryer vent to ensure it is not blocked. This will save energy and may prevent a fire. Manufacturers recommend using rigid venting material – not plastic vents that may collapse and cause blockages.

Friendly Reminders

Keep a Clear Path to Your Meter

Rock Energy Cooperative workers are always careful on the job, but they appreciate clear paths to the meter.

Members are reminded to keep clear access to their meter. Keep firewood, snowdrifts, and other obstacles away from the meter and paths used to reach the meter. This will ensure a safe environment for workers.

Remove Snow from Furnace Pipes

When you shovel your driveway and sidewalk, remember to clear snow away from furnace intake and exhaust pipes.

These pipes on the outside of your house are sometimes just a few inches off the ground and can be buried by snowdrifts.

If snow covers part of the pipe, your furnace probably will continue to work, but the exhaust could begin to back up into your home. That exhaust contains carbon monoxide and other harmful gases. High levels of carbon monoxide in your home can lead to sickness and even cause death.

When exposing the meter and pipes, avoid using a snow blower. Instead, gently remove snow and ice from the area.
