Here's An Opportunity To Help Your Neighbor!

Your donation to Project Lift Up assists low-income members with energy bills

Project Lift Up is Rock Energy Cooperative's voluntary member donation program that is designed to help low-income members pay their energy bill. The funds will go directly to our Rock Cooperative Care program, which is administered by local agencies. Participating is easy and completely voluntary. Choose from four options:



- Round your energy bill up to the nearest whole dollar amount. If your bill is \$83.23, you would pay \$84, contributing 77 cents. The most you could donate would be \$11.88 per year.
- Add \$1 each month to your budget billing plan. If you choose this option, your annual donation would be \$12.
- Add a set contribution each month. For example, \$5 could be added to your monthly statement for an annual contribution of \$60.
- Make a one-time only donation. The amount you select will be added to your next statement.

The small amount of money you contribute each month could help your neighbor in a big way. Please show your generosity to less fortunate members by completing this attached form and returning it to REC. Your donation is tax-deductible, and you can cancel your participation at any time by calling our office.

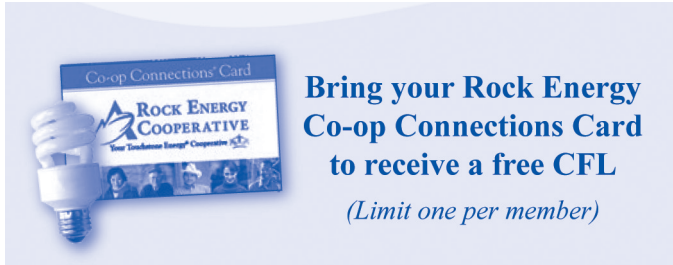

Beware of telephone scam

Rock Energy Cooperative has learned that some members in northern Illinois have received telephone calls from someone claiming to be a ComEd representative who then requests their credit card information and Social Security number.

In one instance, the caller said service would be disconnected if the member did not provide credit card information. In another call, a member was told that lower rates were available from ComEd, but the member needed to provide credit card information. Unlike phone companies, utility providers have a defined service territory and do not solicit consumers to switch services.

If you receive a call like this, hang up immediately and report it to your local police department.

Utah Co-op Buys Two Municipal Facilities

Garkane Energy Cooperative in southern Utah has purchased the electric distribution and transmission facilities of two municipalities—Colorado City in Arizona and Hildale in Utah.
