Tis the Season for Saving Energy

The holiday season is the most expensive time of the year where people spend on food, entertainment, gifts, home and Christmas decorations, etc. On top of these additional costs, most people end up having a hefty electric bill, especially these days when energy costs are going up. With some careful planning, you can save energy and money. Below are some of the many different ways to conserve energy and lower your utility bill this holiday season.



Buy LED Holiday String Lights

There are plenty of options for energy-efficient Christmas lights, like replacing your old incandescent ones with LEDs. It's a smart decision because it's a great way to save energy and, in the end, save money!



Turn the Thermostat Down

Turn down the thermostat while you're sleeping or out of the house. Adjust your thermostat between 65 and 68 degrees. Invest in a smart thermostat that will automatically set the temperature where you want it.



Limit Christmas Light Use, Use a SMART Plug

At high noon, while the sun is out, no one driving by can see those sparkly icicle lights you have hanging off your eaves, so why have them on? Consider buying a smart plug and/or light timer so you can automatically turn your lights off when you need them off.



Cook More Efficiently

If you're planning on cooking multiple different meal items, prep your meal so that items that bake at the same temperature can be cooked simultaneously, cutting down the time that your oven has to be on. Also consider cooking in a crockpot instead of a stove.




Limit Energy Use During High Usage Hours

Using electricity and natural gas more strategically can really save you money. Limit energy use (avoid turning on lights for example) during high usage times (usually 1 to 6 p.m.), as higher demand means higher prices.

Requesting Usage / Consumption History



Average Usage shows you what your typical or average usage is for your selected time period. For example, see your average usage on each day of the week (such as Tuesdays), over the course of a year.

Or, see your typical usage in each hour of the day over the course of two weeks. Discover when you can save the most on your utility bill.

Use the Average Usage Tool

There are multiple different ways you can receive your usage/consumption history:

- ► <u>SmartHub</u>: Most usage/consumption history associated with your account can immediately be found using SmartHub? If you do not have a SmartHub account, you can sign up by going to <u>www.rock.coop</u> and clicking on the red SmartHub button (top of site).
- ▶ On-Line Request: If you would like to receive a history of your usage without using SmartHub, fill out the on-line form: www.rock.coop/consumption-history-request.
