Watch Out For Farm Equipment During Spring Planting Season


Spring planting and fall harvest are busy times. Farmers and workers have big equipment and implements on the road.

Navigating roadways can be dangerous for farm equipment operators and auto drivers who follow behind them.

According to the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health, 410 farmers and farm workers died from work-related injuries in 2019. Transportation incidents, which included tractor overturns, were the leading cause of death for these farmers and farm workers.

Below and to the right you will find some tips to make for a safer and more pleasant drive during the upcoming spring planting season.

- Add extra time when traveling on busy farm roads.
- Give farmers plenty of room on the road.
- When passing, be sure you do so in a passing zone and that there is clear visibility around farm equipment. Watch for oncoming vehicles.
- Go slow. Farm operators often stop or turn into fields.
- Do not assume that a farmer can move over in narrow areas; it is not always possible.
- Honk or motion when passing farmers, they may not see you or know you are there; their equipment is big and noisy.
- Do not tailgate; farmers often can't see you.
- Do not pass and then slow suddenly in front of equipment with implements behind it or farm trucks full of grain. They cannot stop quickly.
- Farmers make wide turns, so give them plenty of time and room.



Rock Energy Rate Adjustments

For the first time since 2015, residential electric base rates will be modified, effective with electric billings after March 15, 2023 (some industrial accounts were adjusted January 1, 2023).

Due to increased costs, particularly on the cooperative's cost of purchased power, the base rates for energy and the monthly facility charge will be increased. In addition, a small distribution demand charge will be implemented to address increased costs to maintain and upgrade the electrical system. For demand rates, the demand charge will increase.

For residential accounts, the last increase to the monthly the facility charge was in 2018, and again, the most recent change to the base rate of energy was in 2015. For residential accounts, the overall increase is 6.3%. For all rate classes, the impact is 7.7%.

Many factors are increasing costs: clean energy goals, supply chain issues, world events, weather and inflation, are some contributing factors. In 2022, Rock Energy experienced a 37% increase in power costs. With power cost representing nearly 70% of all expenses, the impact was substantial.

The cooperative remains cost competitive, while maintaining and upgrading the system to accommodate the needs of our current and future members. Please contact the office if you have any questions.
