# **Keeping Electrical Safety Top-of-Mind!**

May is National Electrical Safety Month, so now is the perfect time to brush up on safety procedures and to make sure that everyone in your home is aware of them in order to prevent unnecessary exposure to electrical hazards and risks.

Being cautious when using electrical appliances, extension cords, light bulbs and other equipment is important. Safety tips should be included in household rules, along with daily behavior expectations for all members of the family. It only takes one mistake to spark an electrical fire, but simple prevention measures can be effective solutions. For instance, don't run appliances around water; don't overload outlets with plugs; and never run electrical cords under rugs.

#### **Electrical Fires**

When an electrical short or spark occurs, it is vital to understand what to do to prevent or put out an electrical fire to keep the damage and devastation from spreading. You should, of course, call 911 or other appropriate emergency services immediately in case of

> electrical injury or fire. There are many common causes of electrical fires and signs to be aware of, such as flickering lights, hot light switches, or frayed electrical cords.

#### **Outdoor Electrical Safety**

Since many electrical hazards can be found near the exterior of your home — and not just inside — it is also important to practice electrical safety outdoors. Keep trees pruned and away from power lines overhead, as well as where the power lines approach the house. Don't fly drones, kites, model aircraft or balloons near power lines. When using a ladder, carefully inspect the surrounding area to be sure it is free from power lines. Always assume that contact with a power line can be deadly, and do not approach a downed power line.

#### LANDSCAPING

Trees are available in the appropriate sizes, densities, and shapes for almost any shade application. To BLOCK solar heat in the summer, but let heat IN during the winter, use deciduous trees. To provide continuous shade or to block heavy winds, use dense evergreen trees or shrubs.

# February Storm Causes Bills to be Higher Than Usual

In mid-February, many natural gas customers across America were slammed with surging prices as southern states like Texas and Oklahoma were hit with a historic winter storm.

Unfortunately, the extreme cold weather in February sent market prices - and ultimately bills skyrocketing. Rock Energy is aware that some of our members are concerned about the higher than normal bill they may have received. To address this issue, we have decreased the number of days billed on some of our members' bills. By doing this, the bill amount is less than what it would have been using a normal billing cycle (normally you are billed for 30 days of energy use per bill). The usage days that have been removed from the current bill will be spread across future bills over the next

few months.
