## **Planning Helps Us Weather Storms**

Being prepared for a storm and knowing what to do in its aftermath can mean the difference between survival and a tragedy.

Lineworkers are often called storm heroes or storm soldiers because they have the knowledge, training, and courage to head into the immediate aftermath of a storm to help others.

They face numerous dangers clearing any lines or equipment that pose a risk to public safety, reconnecting downed lines, and repairing damaged equipment.

The time it takes to restore power can vary widely depending on the extent of a storm's destruction, the number of out-

ages, and when it becomes safe for utility personnel to get to the damaged areas. Whether it is hours or days, it always pays to be prepared.

Your emergency kit should include water bottles, non-perishable food, flashlights, extra batteries, first aid kit, and a portable weather radio.

## Be Prepared Before the Storm

Here are some basic items you should store in your home in case of emergency:

- 📢 Water: Three day supply, one gallon per person per day\_
- 📢 Food: Three day supply, non-perishable, high-energy
- Clothing, bedding, and sanitation supplies
- Tools: Can opener, plates, utensils, flashlight, batteries, cash, bleach, hand sanitizer
- First aid supplies, medicine
- Important documents



paying attention to weather forecasts for your area so that when a storm hits, you can already be in a safe shelter.

If you are outside, head inside to avoid being caught in a storm. Also, have your emergency kit within easy reach.

Even after a storm passes, it can leave hazards in its wake. Stay far away from all downed lines and any objects they

are touching. If you see a downed line, immediately call 911.

Do not venture out on roads after a storm unless necessary.

If your vehicle comes in contact with a downed pow-

er line, do not leave the car. Downed lines can still carry electricity, and while you are safe inside your vehicle, creating two points of contact by touching the surrounding ground could result in shock or electrocution.

Wait for utility professionals to make sure the power line is de-energized before exiting the car.
