Williams Tree Farm, a Rock Energy Cooperative member, has been family owned and operated for over 77 years. The farm was purchased in the 1940's by Carlton and Amelia Williams and their son Wayne. Originally a dairy and hog farm, timbers were harvested from the farm for what was known as The Wagon Wheel, a historic resort in Rockton, IL.


Located at 4661 Yale Bridge Road in Rockton, IL. today Williams Tree Farm offers cut-your-own and pre-cut trees, greens, horse-drawn wagon rides and much more. There is also a giftshop and café on site. Following the holiday season, during the rest of

the year, Williams Tree Farm is a popular venue for weddings and other events.

Williams Tree Farm co-owner Karen Williams said the tree farm today is a reflection of years learning from their customers and retaining a well-trained, responsive staff. In addition to a small café that serves family favorites like hot dogs and hot chocolate served in a cozy retreat with a fireplace. Williams Tree Farm has a variety of Christmas ornaments, crafts and gift items. Williams said most items are sourced from local providers.

## Former Rock Energy General Manager **Inducted Into Cooperative Hall of Fame**

Sheldon C. Petersen, the retired CEO of the National Rural Utilities Cooperative Finance Corp. and a "relentless" advocate for electric cooperatives, was inducted into the Cooperative Hall of Fame in October by the Cooperative Development Foundation at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C.

The lowa native began his career in 1976 as a staff assistant at Nishnabotna Valley Rural Electric Cooperative in Harlan, Iowa. Just four years later, he became general manager of Rock County Electric Cooperative Association—now known as Rock Energy Cooperative—in Janesville, WI.

Petersen joined CFC in 1983 as an area representative, providing financial management consultation to rural electric co-ops. He became CEO of CFC in 1995, leading them for more than 26 years, dramatically expanding its loan portfolio from about \$7 billion to \$27 billion and helping electric co-ops invest in their communities and adapt to changing times.

In addition to his co-op hall of fame induction, Petersen was the recipient of WECA's 2020 Special ACE Award, and in 2022, NRECA presented Petersen with the Clyde T. Ellis Award, which honors those who have made exemplary contributions that promote the principles and progress of rural electrification and the development and use of natural resources.

"I'm so grateful to have had the opportunity to work in an industry that has such an important purpose and to work with so many passionate people," said Petersen. "This is a nice way to cap off what has been such an incredible adventure."

## **REC Expands Scholarship Program**
